

## **Suicide Prevention Training in Clark County**

Lifeline Connections continues offering *FREE* Mental Health First Aid and *FREE Question. Persuade. Respond.* (QPR) Suicide Prevention training to Clark County.

Trainings are provided at our <u>Recovery Resource Center</u> or a location of your choice.

In Q1 2024, 69 individuals participated in Mental Health First Aid Training and 43 participated in QPR Suicide Prevention Training. *All 112 are now better equipped to serve our community!*

Medication Assisted Recovery/Medication Assisted Treatment uses medications to reduce cravings and withdrawal symptoms and block the effects of substance use.

We have **seven** locations across Washington State to serve the community! Many have walk-in hours. If you or someone you know is ready to start their journey recovery, our Medication Assisted Recovery program can help!

## **Iesha's Resilience and Recovery**

"On June 4, 2012, my children were removed from my care. Unfortunately, I continued to use resulting in a deep depression. In 2014, I finally was ready for recovery. My husband and myself started to attend a meeting called the Light House. The message that struck a chord with me was "all you need is the desire to stop using." While attending that meeting someone told me about Lifeline Connections.

I got a bed date for June 24, 2014. When I arrived at inpatient treatment, I rocked it! I loved it because I was ready to make that change. The week I was to be discharged I had not found stable housing yet. So, I asked for an additional week to find housing.

I was accepted into an Oxford House. By the grace of God, I started to build a solid foundation for my recovery. Today I am the mother, wife, and person that I should have been all along. My motto is: "Do everything to stay sober." Today my husband and I have our own place and my babies are home. I am always making strides to be a better person."
